- 1. In chapters 10 and 11 of Acts, we learn that the good news of Jesus Christ has been given to the Gentiles as well as to the Jews. That must have involved some tough conversations-- first, to convince Peter to begin a ministry for the Gentiles, and then for Peter to convince the Jewish Christians in power to accept the Gentiles as Christians. Likewise, working to break down boundaries of race and class in Baltimore has taken some tough conversations, including the one between BYOP and Brown Memorial.
 - 1. With your youth group, think about why these tough conversations are so important.**
 - 2. Brainstorm ways that your youth group can begin to engage in those conversations. Are there organizations like BYOP in your community that you can invite to your gathering time? Is there another worshiping community you can partner with-- maybe one whose members look differently than those at your church?**
