- 1. Because youth aren't yet old enough to vote, it's also easy to forget to consider their opinions. How can your worshipping community create space for youth to voice their opinions and concerns for this upcoming election? How can you communicate those concerns to adult voters in the community?**
- 2. Brainstorm with your youth how they can become more informed about what is going on in the community (for example, ask students to bring articles from that week's newspaper to youth group gatherings, visit city hall, have local leaders be guest speakers one night.)**
- 3. Read Jeremiah 1:5-7. When Jeremiah is still very young, God calls him to serve as "a prophet to the nations." Jeremiah is afraid because he is so young, worrying he does not have the wisdom to speak against injustice. Akia says that it is the young people who take action, and the older people who give us the wisdom to do so. In your community, how can you bring these age groups together to learn from one another? How can they work together to create change?**
